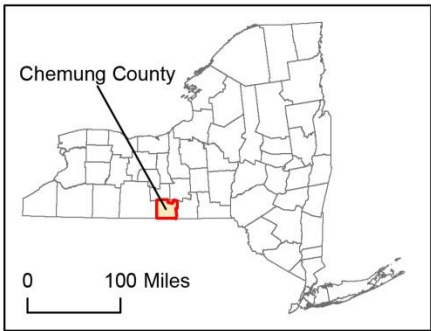

Towns, Cities, Indian Reservations, and Incorporated Villages

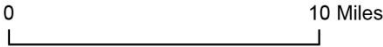


New York State Counties

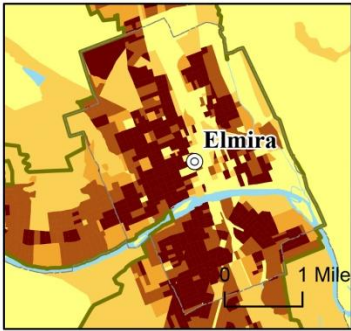
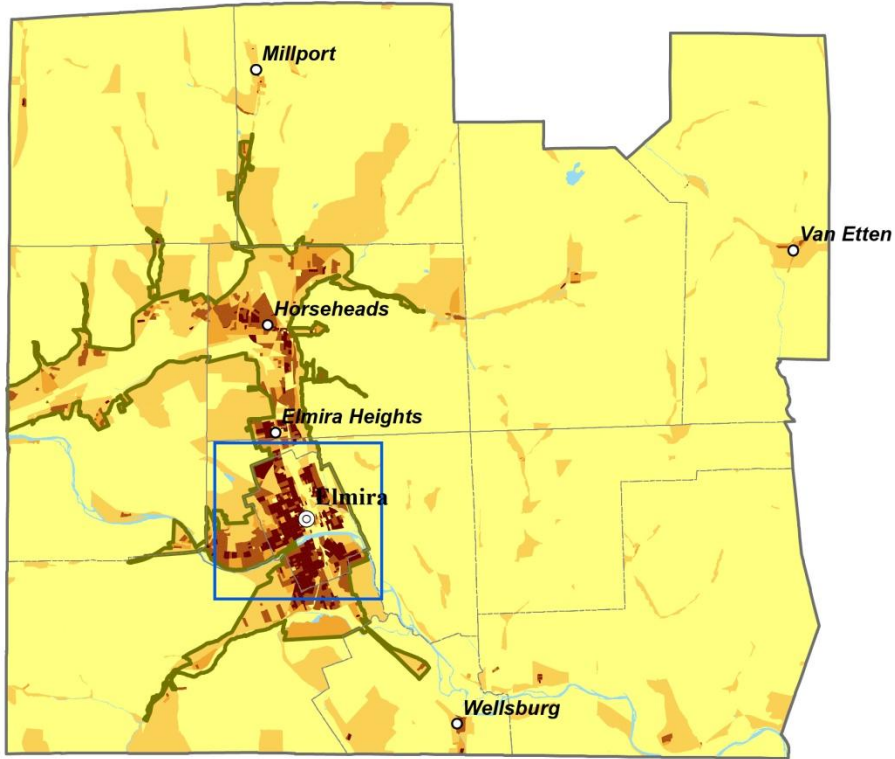

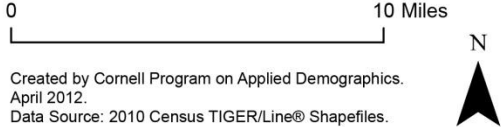

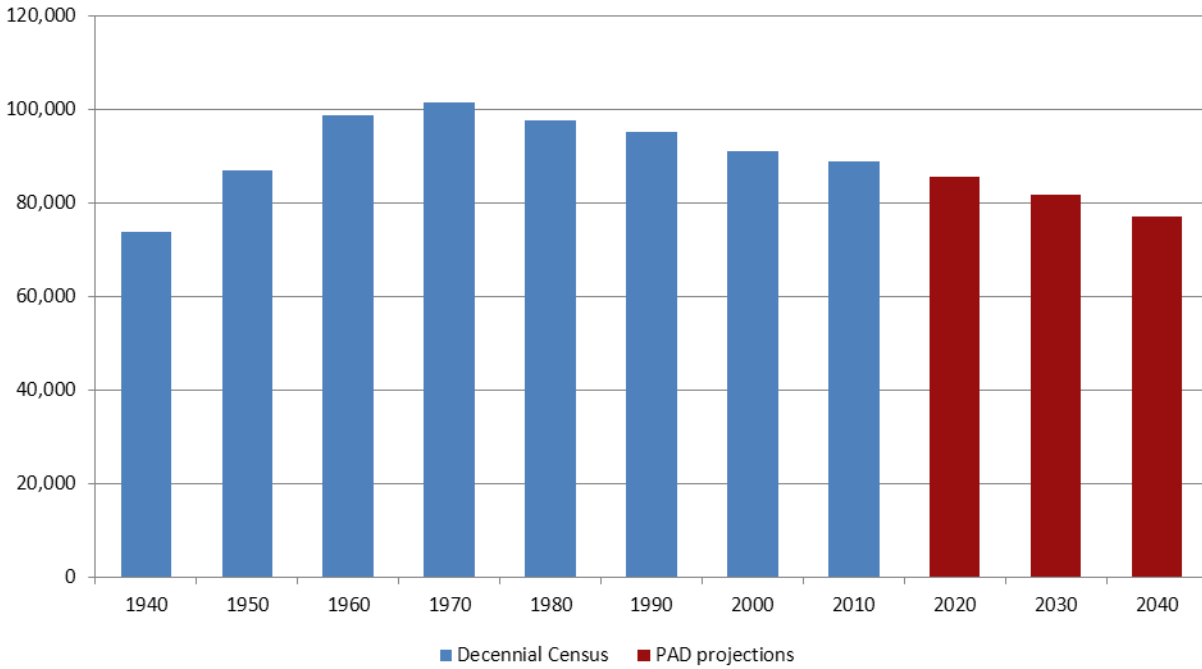

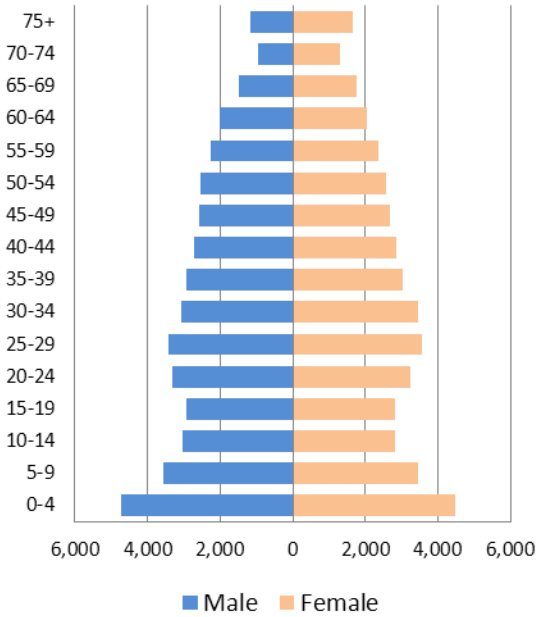
Total population, Chemung County, 1940-2040



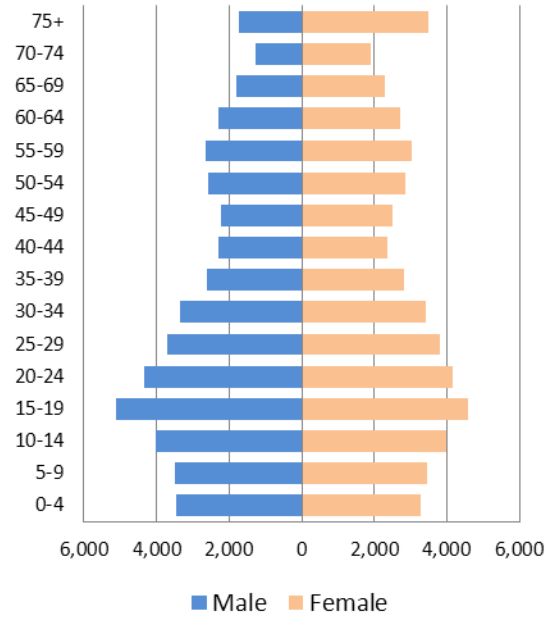

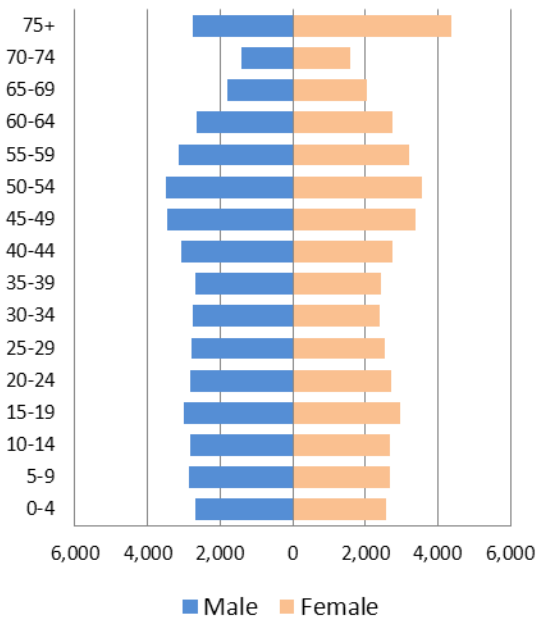
1950 Population Pyramid,
Chemung County



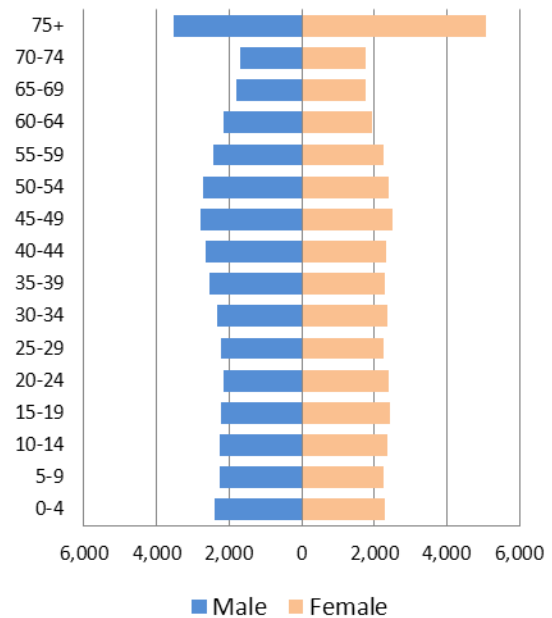
1980 Population Pyramid,

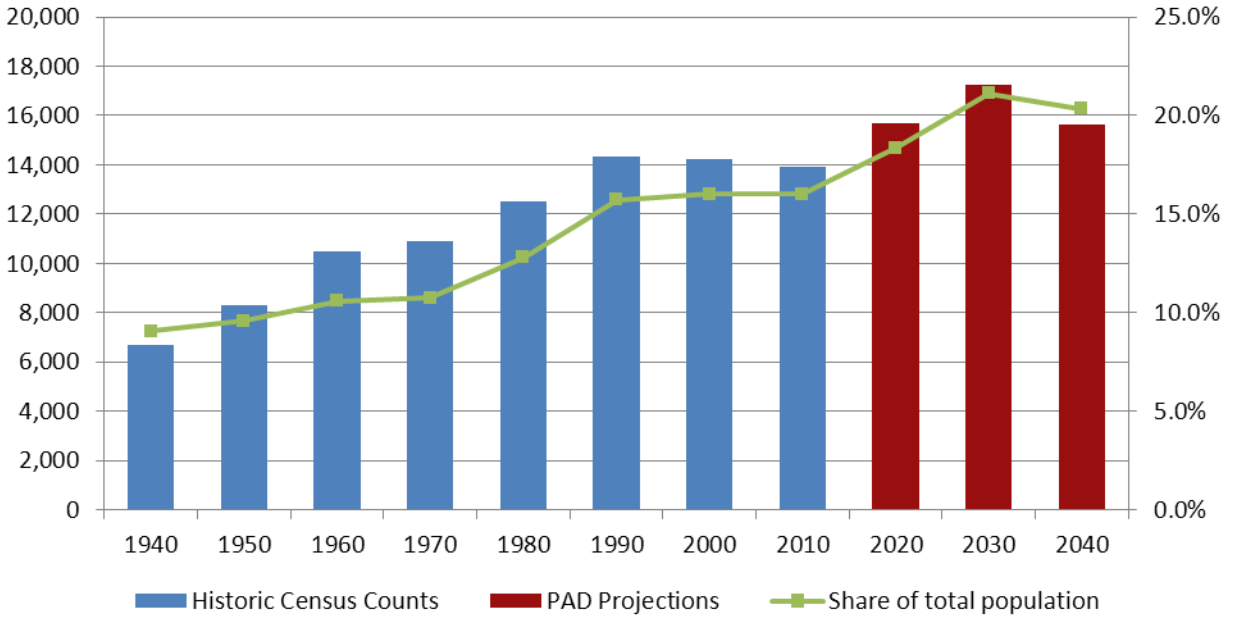

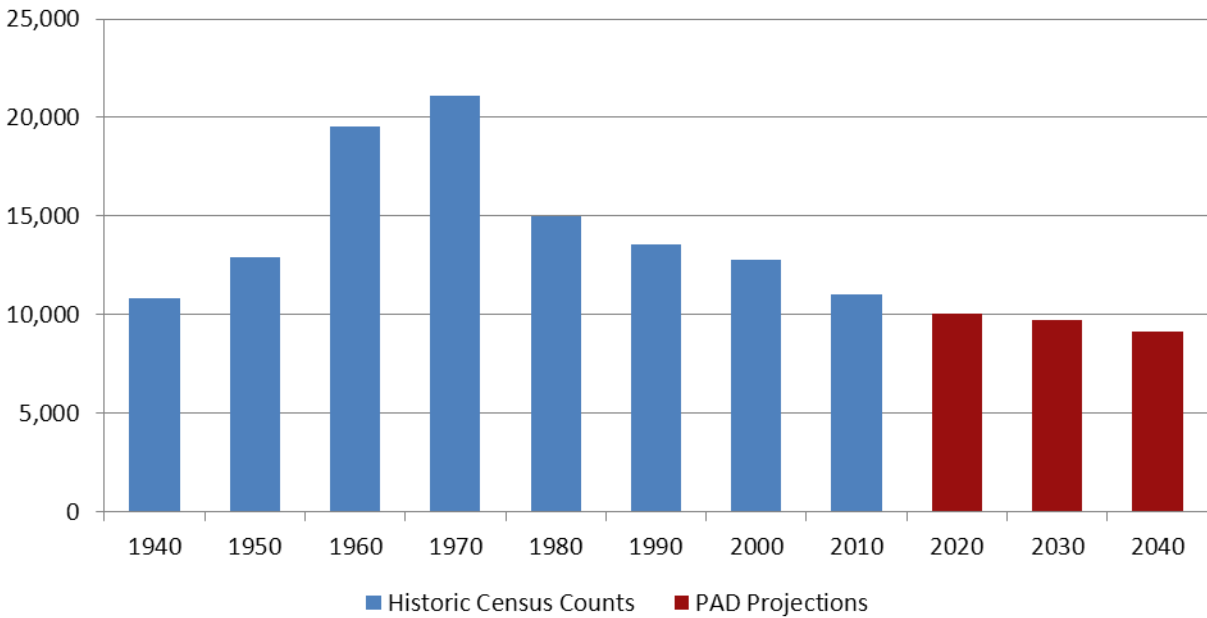


Historic and projected: Selected age groups

Population Age 65 and Over, Chemung County, 1940 - 2040

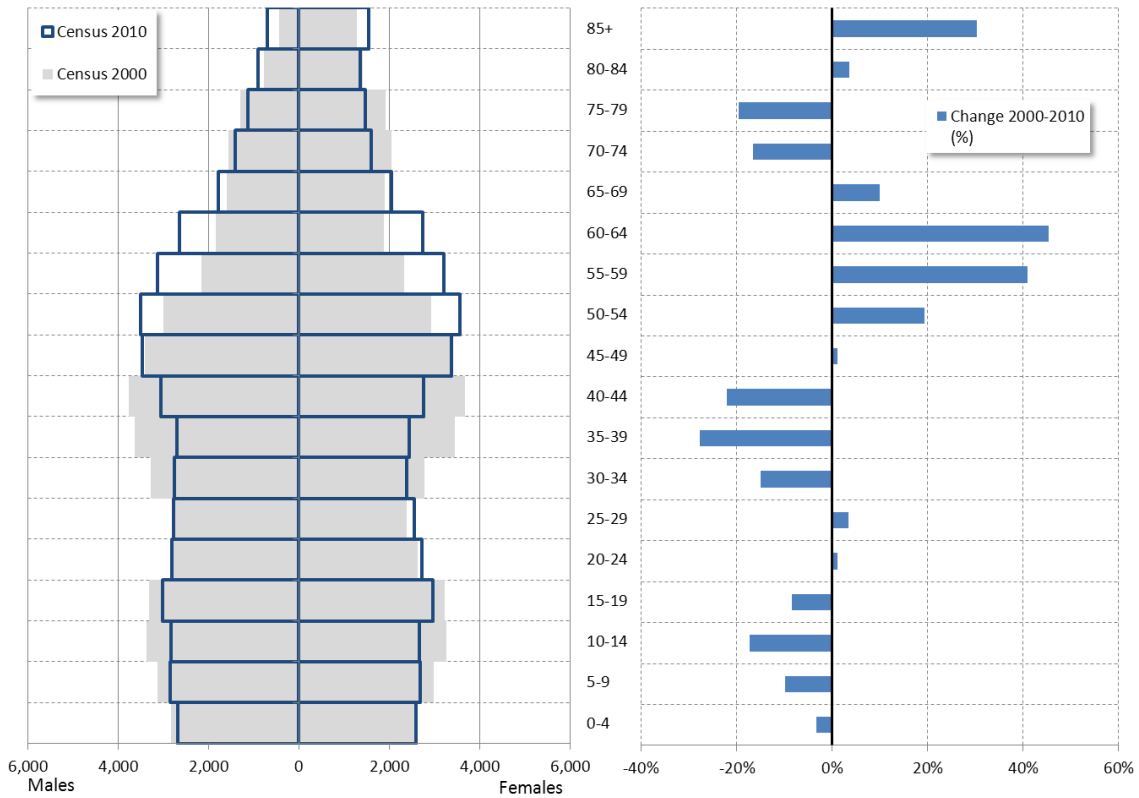


Population Age 5-14, Chemung County, 1940 - 2040



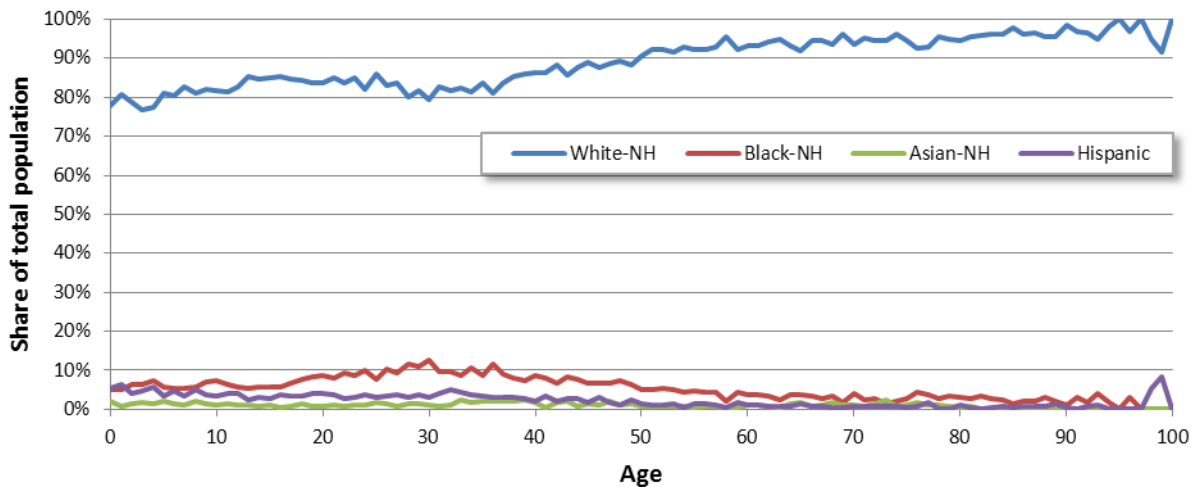
Census 2010 compared with Census 2000: age composition

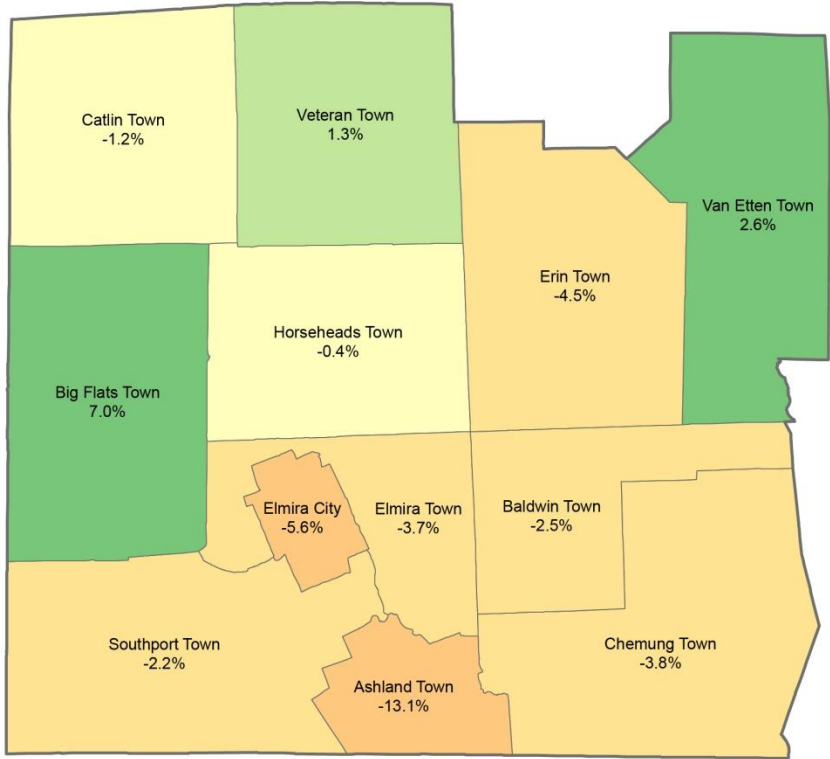
Census 2010 compared with Census 2000: race by age

Race/ethnicity by age, Chemung County, 2010



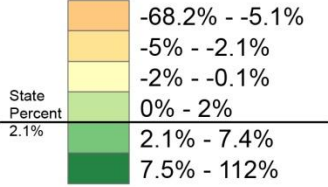
