
Historic and projected: Total population








1950 Population Pyramid,




1980 Population Pyramid, **Onondaga County**


2010 Population Pyramid, **Onondaga County**



2040 Population Pyramid, **Onondaga County**






Population Age 65 and Over, Onondaga County, 1940 - 2040

Population Age 5-14, Onondaga County, 1940 - 2040




Census 2010 compared with Census 2000: age composition


